Countess Moutbatten Hospice

Countess Mountbatten House is an NHS hospice that opened in 1977 and is currently part of the Southampton University Hospitals Trust. The hospice serves a population of around 720,000 people.

The Hospice service provides specialist palliative care for patients with cancer and other life-limiting illnesses in the inpatient unit and Day Care Centre located at the hospice in West End, Southampton; a hospital palliative care team providing support in Southampton General Hospital. and through community team of clinical nurse specialists led by consultants in palliative medicine who support patients in their own homes throughout the catchment area.

Haiti update - total MD105 donations US\$629,891:-

Donations from Lions Clubs throughout the world have now almost reached US\$5,000,000 through the "Lions for Hope" programme.

Day to day supplies and assistance at the Lions tented camps are being provided by LCIF working in conjunction with the International Organisation of Migration



and partnership arrangements are being concluded with USAID and Catholic Relief Services, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) are continuing to work alongside other NGO's (Non-Government Organisations) and the Haitian Government to put in place a comprehensive rebuilding plan to restore major facilities. LCIF plans still identify education and medical facilities as its major objectives.

Lions in Haiti and LCIF are also currently evaluating the construction of more than 600 semi-permanent

homes in partnership with NGO (HELP).

A Memorandum of Understanding is now in place to partner Humani Terra to provide orthopaedic surgeons and in the longer term, a national trauma and burns treatment unit. SightSavers Vision 2020 also has a planned project for the area and the LCIF SightFirst Grants coordinators are also involved in the planning work.
