Membership Information

Club Recruitment Process –

This process will apply to any person who displays an interest in joining Swanwick Lions Club, including Lions who wish to transfer from their club, ex-Lions, and new members.

- Attend at least two club business meetings, either in person or via 700m
- o Take part in at least one club activity
- Meet with the club Membership Officer who will provide the prospective members with details of both Swanwick Lions and Lions Clubs International
- o Once all these steps have been completed the Membership Officer can, if satisfied, issue a recommendation to the club that the prospective member should be invited to join the club
- o If a majority of the club vote to accept the recommendation of the Membership Officer, then the prospective member should be invited to join the club
- o Once a member has been inducted, they should be allocated to one of the clubs committees so that they can attend their monthly meetings.

Sponsor – Each club member has a mentor within the club who is there to discuss and support new members with any activities they wish to be involved in.

Meetings

Business meetings are held monthly at Sarisbury Green Community Centre on the first Tuesday of the month, at 7:30pm (in person or via Zoom).

The President, whose annual term of office commences at the beginning of July, runs the meeting to an agenda produced by the Secretary.

To keep the meeting as manageable as possible there are subcommittees comprising of Welfare, Fundraising, and Membership, who meet as necessary during the month and prepare reports for the business meeting.

The agenda, committee and any other reports are forwarded to the Secretary one week before the meeting and collated into our club magazine. This is emailed to us all so we have a chance to read it before the meeting.

If you are unable to attend the meeting, please inform the secretary beforehand.

Any decisions needed are voted on by a show of hands and we aim to reach an agreement, but decisions may be deferred if more information is needed. At least 50% of members need to be present to vote on a decision, either in person or via Zoom.

Club members may be asked to join one of the committees and encouraged to change each year to gain experience.

We occasionally have visitors from other clubs and we also may invite people who seek our support or have been funded by us. Any guests will need to sign our Visitors Book for contact and emailing purposes.

Fundraising

This is an important part of our club that enables us to raise money to support individuals, youth organisations, and charities in our local area. We run many other fundraising events throughout the year, such as pub quizzes, and we are open to suggestions for charities and new events.

Annual Duck Race

We run this event every August Bank Holiday with Eastleigh Lions Club at Mansbridge Southampton.





Santa Sleigh Collections

During the Christmas period we run static and street collections. The money raised goes towards the Presidents' charity of choice.

Welfare

Our Principle Aims

The main focus in Welfare is towards providing support financially to identified individuals and local charitable organisations.

Referrals can come from anyone including individuals, care workers, NHS, local youth groups etc.

Welfare committee members investigate request and report back to the main meeting with their recommendations. Small purchases (or up to £200) can be made by the Welfare Officer in an emergency, for instance new shoes.

Message in a Bottle

These small bottles are distributed for free through hospitals, surgeries, and chemists and contain personal and medical details. They are purchased by the club and handed out free of charge. Bottles are kept in the fridge and a green cross sticker placed on the fridge and inside the front entrance to the house alerts emergency services in the event of an incident.



Youth

ROAR

ROAR is an innovative ideas competition for primary schools. It is an inspirational and fun learning experience for children aged 7 to 11, encouraging their imagination to create "world changing ideas", this helps them to "think and dream big".

The primary purpose of ROAR is to benefit children, but it also provides Lions Clubs with a splendid opportunity to serve their local community better by engaging more widely and deeply with local schools.

ROAR is organised and run in your local schools by our partners **8billionideas**, the award-winning education company. They have been involved with running ROAR for 6 years and ROAR is now an MD youth programme.

ROAR is teacher-friendly with a fully prepared teacher pack, including all lesson plans needed. It covers different areas of the required school's curriculum as required by OFSTED, including literacy, citizenship, PSHE and STEM.

The programme runs during the autumn term and each school holds a final to decide on their winning idea. The winning team in each school will then create a short video presentation of their idea, which will then be sent to 8billionideas.

Each Lions District will then judge their schools' entries and select the winning schools, before the National Awards day on the 6^{th of} December when we will showcase the best idea from each of our 8 Districts.
